The Chair opened the meeting of the Liquor Control Commissioners at 6:30pm. Steve Leach made a motion which was seconded by Lee Sturtevant to approve the liquor and tobacco licenses as follows; Morrisville Bowl, L, Grand Union, L & T, Oriental Station Restaurant, L, Price Chopper, L & T, Buckles & Stuff, T. Approved and signed. The Liquor Control Commissioners meeting was adjourned at 6:31 pm.

SELECTBOARD MEETING

The Chair opened the Selectboard meeting in the Municipal Conference Room at 6:31 p.m.

MINUTES: Steve Leach made the motion, seconded by Lee Sturtevant to approve the minutes of the Board meeting on March 9, 1998 as presented. Passed.

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT'S REPORT

There will be a meeting for all Town officials on May 20. We are all encouraged to attend. A letter was received from Joie Marshall thanking Eric Dodge for all he has done for the children of this community.

GUESTS

Mac Miller was available to discuss the LRSWD. Mac discussed the Manager's resignation and stated that the manager was uncertain of the district's solvency. Mac feels the LRSWD is very inefficiently run and the Board Of Selectmen should consider Morristown leaving the LRSWD. Brian stated that in his opinion leaving the district would not be a wise choice for the Town. Lee asked Mac if he had any suggestions for cutting cost and Mac replied that the Manager should not be replaced. The Board thanked Mac for his viewpoint and will discuss the possibility of a special meeting at the April 6 Board meeting.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

HIGHWAY: Bill reported that the Village has been busy sanding and salting and he may have to get more salt. Cliff hit Sonny Demars garage on Sunday and that will need to be repaired. The pump was lowered 110 ft. at the Town well and there seems to be plenty of water now. Art Therrien is now home recovering from his operation Bill expects him to be back to work some time in May. Brian discussed with Bill a letter which was received regarding some broken up pavement and sidewalk area at an apartment house in the Village. It was decided that the area will be evaluated in the Spring. Steve Leach made a motion seconded by Ken Grimes to approve the Comp time for Bill. Passed.

POLICE: Richard reported that there have been about 190 calls, 9 arrests, and a lot of minor traffic incidents during the last two weeks. The '94 cruiser is now out of the garage after having a complete motor job done. The repair costs are about \$2600.00 and Ford should pay about 60%. Richard stated that the '95 cruiser probably has the same problem. A lot of meetings have been attended recently. Local Police Departments and Schools will be meeting to discuss a plan for under-age drinking. Richard has been looking into a mug shot camera system and advises that they are expensive. Goulds will start the electrical work on March 24. Richard discussed with the Board a complaint he received about a parking ticket.

FIRE: Wayne had nothing new to report for the Fire Department this week.

HEALTH: David reported that he has inspected all the schools and has sent the proper paperwork to the State. David
