

**TOWN OF MORRISTOWN
SELECTBOARD MINUTES**

Brian Greenia opened the Regular Meeting of the Morristown Selectboard at 6:04 PM.

At 7:46 PM, Don made motion to adjourn to a meeting as the Morristown Liquor Control Board. Second motion made by Lee. Passed. Don made motion to accept and sign the current Liquor, Tobacco and Catering Licenses, as presented to the Selectboard by Mary Ann Wilson. Lee made second motion. Passed.

At 7:59 PM, motion was made by Don to exit the meeting as the Morristown Liquor Control Board, and reconvene the regular meeting of the Morristown Selectboard. Second motion made by Lee. Passed.

AA REPORT: Peter Jensvold's concern, regarding the placement of his mailbox next to the sign for the Noyes House museum, was conveyed to the Selectboard.

The letter presented to the Selectboard, requesting a dead-end sign on West High Street, was also discussed. It was decided that more information would be gathered to determine the right-of-way width at this location, and that this be added to the agenda for the next Regular Selectboard Meeting.

MINUTES: Motion for discussion and approval of the minutes of the previous regular Selectboard meeting, held on February 21st, was made by Lee. Second motion made by Don. Passed. The following amendments were made: under the 'Health' heading, it was added that Dave Godfrey will be following up on the hot water system at the school, and the sentence referring to a new sand and water mound system was stricken; under 'General Government' it was added that the community groups (in reference to the 'Motown Arts' group) must obtain permission from the Selectboard before applying for any municipal grants; under 'New Business' "traffic yield on Lower Elmore Street" was stricken, and replaced by "Academy Park on Upper Main Street". The amended minutes were then voted on and approved.

HIGHWAY: Bill stated that he has been patching holes in the roads. He added that there was some damage from water during the last two weeks, but not as much as in other towns, [where there was flooding]. The dirt roads are currently being graded.

The Selectboard gave their consent to have Bill purchase a used army truck, for approximately \$1,000, through surplus goods.

The bid from J&B; for a dump truck for the highway department, has been withdrawn.

A motion to approve and sign two request vouchers for overtime compensation for Bill Moulton was made by Don. Second motion made by Lee. Passed.

Mike Wright discussed the letter submitted to the Selectboard on behalf of NAC Hearthstone, concerning Stafford Avenue. He also presented the Board with photos of the intersection in question. It was suggested that the existing stop sign be moved to the in-bound lane, and a yield sign for out-going traffic be added. Bill Moulton and Richard Keith were asked for their advice in the matter. Bill agreed to further review the situation, and discuss it with Howard Manosh. It was decided to add this matter as an agenda item for the next Selectboard meeting.

POLICE: Richard stated that it had been fairly busy during the past two weeks. There were 160 calls made, and two transports to detox. He told the Selectboard that the officers have all been doing a great job concerning some recent cases.

There has been one bid received for the Public Safety Building flooring, with one more pending.

Approval was given by the Selectboard to appoint Derek Libby as a part-time officer, at a pay rate of \$14.94 per hour. Lee Made motion to this effect. Don made second motion. Passed.
