 - d. Mountain View – Spauldings are going to work on the back fence and the side towards Morristown Corners. Owner does not want the berry bushes to be cut on his side. Hoping Randall Plante will agree that we don't have to put anything back. Dennis to chat with him. One stone needs to be repaired.
 - e. Plains – Lots available for sale but we are not advertising.
 - f. RiverView – mowers will have to help keep watch for homeless campers. Sold one lot in the new area.
 - g. Wheeler – nothing new to report.
 - h. All cemeteries need liming to keep the moss down. Ask Spauldings to do.
